

Gerald Jones and his wife, Stephanie, along with their son Timothy, from Roseville CA, were in the Dakota Sunset Museum to show Timothy the family corn sheller that is in the museum barn. The family also had visits with Frank Jones, Gerald's uncle. The hand cranked corn sheller was originally owned by Edward F. Jones (1870-1952) who came to Potter County in 1907 and settled in Artichoke Township. The sheller was used by three generations, Edward, son Otis, and his grandson Gerald E., who donated it to the Museum. Gerald's father, Gerald E., graduated from GHS in 1951. He was the first person in GHS history to take a superior rating at the state Declam contest! He gave the reading "The Raven". The picture shows Timothy, Stephanie, and Gerald in the museum barn beside the corn sheller.
